The conference will begin at 7:00pm on the evening of Monday May 21, and will conclude after lunch on Friday, May 25, 2012. It will include a combination of oral sessions and poster sessions, covering the latest findings across many topics in liver metabolism, diseases and cancer biology by bringing together a group of scientific leaders.
